

Clarification of the peer review status of periodicals published by AEGIS member centres

The AEGIS Working Group on the Evaluation of Academic Output (Clara Carvalho – ISCTE Lisbon; Pierre Boilley – Cemaf Paris; Leo de Haan – ASC Leiden; Andreas Mehler – IAK/GIGA Hamburg; Dieter Neubert – BIGSAS Bayreuth; Carin Norberg – NAI Uppsala) was asked by the Leiden Plenary of 2007 and the Bordeaux Plenary 2008 to clarify the peer review status of periodicals relevant to African Studies, starting with periodicals published by AEGIS members centres.

To identify the peer review status of periodicals, the Working Group made a distinction between the following categories:

1. a non-refereed journal;
2. a refereed journal;
3. a double-blind refereed journal; and
4. a journal on the list of the Institute for Scientific Information.

The Working Group asked the editors-in-chief of *Afrika Spectrum*, *Cadernos de Estudos Africanos* and *Politique Africaine* and *Afriche & Orienti* to document and clarify their system of reviewing papers sent to them for publication.

The Working Group arrived at the following conclusion, which was endorsed by the AEGIS Plenary at its Bordeaux meeting on 2 September 2008, with respect to the status of periodicals published by AEGIS member centres.

- *Afrika Spectrum*: Category 4 – double-blind refereed and on the ISI list
- *Cadernos de Estudos Africanos*: Category 3 – double-blind refereed
- *Politique Africaine*: Category 3 – double-blind refereed

The AEGIS Plenary at its Leipzig meeting on 3 June 2009 endorsed the Working Group's conclusion with respect to *Afriche & Orienti*:

- *Afriche & Orienti*: Category 2 - refereed
