

IntraUrban Variation In Gender Accessibility to Urban Land for Housing Development In Enugu, Nigeria.

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The importance of Housing development cannot be over-emphasized. Many factors such as income, education and gender grouping may affect people's accessibility to urban land. This paper is out to examine the intra urban variation in men and women's accessibility to urban land for housing development by positing the case of Enugu, Nigeria.

A total of 420 households will be interviewed from 22 residential districts of Enugu Metropolis using already prepared questionnaires. The information collected from will be analyzed inferentially and discussed. With particular reference to different zones with respect to the level of accessibility of men and women to urban land for housing development.

The need for planners to consider the relevance of Gender factors in the development process as they touch on land issues will be highlighted.
