

## **Clarification of the peer review status of periodicals and publishers relevant to African Studies**

The AEGIS Working Group on the Evaluation of Academic Output (presently consisting of Clara Carvalho, Pierre Boilley, Leo de Haan, Andreas Mehler, Dieter Neubert and Carin Norberg) was asked by the Bordeaux Plenary of 2008 to complete the provisional list of periodicals and publishers relevant to African Studies (presented at the Bordeaux Plenary) with the help of the member centres and then to clarify the peer review status of at least the most popular periodicals and publishers.

The Working Group arrived at the following conclusion, which was endorsed by the AEGIS Plenary at its Leipzig meeting on 3 June 2009. The list of periodicals and publishers is based on the most frequently used (i.e. mentioned 3 times or more) publication channels of the Centres in Basel, Birmingham, Bologna, Bordeaux, Hamburg, Leiden, Lisbon and Uppsala.
